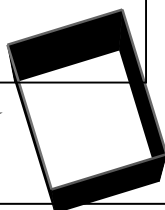

There are lots of things your family can do to help reduce, reuse and recycle. Each year there are between 500 billion and 1 trillion plastic bags used worldwide. That is over 1 million bags per minute. Most of these bags end up in landfills or worse yet as litter. Encourage your family to begin carrying reusable bags. Family Fun!

Get your family together for a fun art / craft project! Your goal is to make a family craft using things your family would normally throw away! Be as creative as you can—there are lots of things you can do!

Here are some ideas to get you started:

- **Make a necklace from the plastic lids of milk cartons.** Cut a small circle that will fit inside the lid from the edge of some paper you are throwing out. Draw a design on the paper and then glue it inside the lid. Have an adult poke a hole in the edge of the lid to run a ribbon through and you have a custom made necklace! You can also glue a magnet on the back for the fridge!
- **Have an adult cut the bottom half off of a milk carton.** Cut pictures out of old magazines. Using craft glue that sticks to plastic, glue the pictures to the outside of the carton folding the magazine pages over the top of the carton. Once the pictures are glued on, cover the entire outside with ModPodge or a half water / half craft glue solution to protect and seal the picture edges. You can use this for a key or small item catch all in your kitchen or entry way.
